High-Impact Practices (HIPs)

Five high-impact practices (HIPs)

- One HIP from a redesigned first year experience
- One HIP will be a capstone experience (e.g., internship, capstone course, field study)
- Three or more HIPs will be determined by degree programs

Employer Engagement Experiences

Three employer engagement experiences (within & outside of HIPs)

- HIP: One of these should be high-intensity that requires significant employer engagement
Examples: Internships, capstones, community-based projects, employer-driven projects
- Non-HIP: Other Non-HIP employer-connected practices (potential to be required in courses).
Examples: Interview a professional, job shadowing, employer panel, guest speakers, career fairs

Responsible AI Skills

Responsible AI skills

Provide students with at least a foundational level of AI fluency that allows them to use AI responsibly within the context of their degree program and associated career-relevant settings.

Enduring Human Skills

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Provide students with enduring skills that support lifelong learning and engaged citizens (TBD - ~10 skills). Sample skills: Critical thinking, collaboration, communication, self-awareness, adaptability, ethical reasoning
